GAME GUIDE

- Fort Lee fell to Pascack Hills on the road on 1/14 in their fourth divisional contest of the year, 63-45.
- Girls hoops: Fort Lee defeated Pascack Hills at home on 1/14, 34-31. The game winner was a three-point goal by junior Yihsi Huang with 8.6 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter. The Bridgemen are now 9-2 on the season, 3-1 in-division. Fort Lee has won four games in a row, dating back to 1/7/20 vs Ramsey.
- Fort Lee's last matchup against the Huskies came on February 5, 2019, with Dumont winning, 65-55. The smallest margin of victory for either team in the last five games was three points (1/10/19: DMT defeated FL, 61-48).
- Next Home Game: The Bridgemen continue their six-game home stand with a Saturday afternoon matchup with the Northern Valley - Old Tappan Golden Knights at 3 P.M. on 1/18. The contest against NVOT is the nightcap of four games being played as part of the 2019 Jeffrey G. Murren Coaches vs Cancer Classic.
- *Upcoming Games: Following the contest vs NVOT, Fort Lee will host Ridgefield Park on 1/21, Cliffside Park on 1/23, Memorial (WNY) on 1/25 and DePaul Catholic on 1/28.*
- In the 2018-19 season, Fort Lee proved their mettle as a defensive team with 17.1 defensive rebounds per game in head coach Adam Shrager's inaugural season in "The Fort." The Orange and Black also averaged 8.3 steals per game last season for a total of 225 steals in the '18-'19 campaign. On the offensive side of the ball, Fort Lee players achieved double-doubles five times.
- Power Points Check: As of 1/15/20, Fort Lee sits 18th on the NJSIAA North 2, Group II table with 45 power points through seven contests.

On 1/14, the Bridgemen trailed to Montvale for a Big North Conference American Division matchup with the Pascack Hills Cowboys. Pascack Hills would top the visitors, 63-45. Fort Lee fell to 1-3 in-division after the contest.

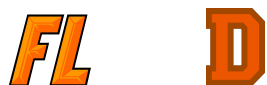
Junior G/F Hamza Ahmad lead the scoring for Fort Lee with 18 points. Only three Bridgemen would score from behind the three-point line with Ahmad, Luis Armas and Raffi Gueyikian scoring the long ball in Montvale.

As a team, the Bridgemen shot eight-for-10 from the free throw line. After the first eight minutes of play, Pascack Hills posted a 20-18 mark which was the closest lead they held after a quarter in the game.

For the Cowboys, Jake Morales lead the scoring affair with 18 of his team's 63 points in the contest.

Luis!: Senior G/F Luis Armas has scored in double-digit figures in all but one game this season for the Bridgemen. Armas scored 15 points in the matchup vs Pascack Hills on 1/14.

We Call Him 'H': Junior G/F Hamza Ahmad scored 18 points for the Orange and Black in the game against the Thunderbirds. Ahmad shot six-for-six from the free throw line. The 6'2 junior also picked up three two-point field goals on the road.

Off the Bench: Nine Bridgemen participated in the contest at Pascack Hills on 1/14. Coming off the bench for the the Bridgemen were junior Warren Wilkerson, senior Josh Estella, senior Sam Morell and freshman Isiah Stang. Only Morell would score (two points).

Upcoming Stretch: Following the game vs Dumont, the Bridgemen continue their six-game home stretch with Northern Valley - Old Tappan, Ridgefield Park, Cliffside Park, Memorial (WNY) and DePaul Catholic coming to "The Fort" from 1/21-28. Fort Lee will then hit the road on 1/30 for their second contest of the year vs Mahwah.

2018-19 In Review:

The 2018-19 season brought about a wave of change for the Bridgemen, beginning with the man at the helm. Adam Shrager joined the Bridgemen as head coach following a tenure at Champion High School in Boerne, Tex. (Full bio is available on the Media Resources page).

Fort Lee began the season on a three-game skid falling to Dwight Morrow, Westwood Regional and Ramsey at home before picking up three consecutive wins in the Jack Reilly Holiday Tournament vs Lyndhurst, NV - Demarest and Paramus Catholic, culminating in their championship berth. Towards the midway stretch of the season, the Bridgemen notched big wins over longtime rivals Cliffside Park and Ridgefield Park, sweeping the home-and-away series with both schools.

Perhaps the most thrilling victory for the Orange and Black came on January 24, 2019, against Mahwah at home when senior Huasly Paredes-Garcia launched a game-winning three-point field goal with 2.9 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter; Fort Lee would take the game, 59-58.

In the first round of the 2018-19 NJSIAA North 2, Group II State Sectional Tournament, the tenth-seeded Bridgemen traveled to the section's seventh-seeded Madison Dodgers for a high scoring duel that saw both teams put up a combined 131 points. Despite having three players score in double-digits and a team total of nine three-point field goals made, Fort Lee would fall on the road, 69-62, ending their season.

Fort Lee finished the season with a 14-13 record, 6-8 in the Big North Conference American Division.

In May of 2019, Paredes-Garcia announced his decision to continue playing basketball at Utica College, a Division III school in Utica, N.Y.
