WELCOME MONIQUE KIM TO CENTRAL OFFICE

After receiving a Masters in Elementary Education from Teachers College at Columbia University, Monique began her teaching career 16 years ago as a sixth-grade teacher in Fort Lee at Elementary School #2. She also taught third and fourth grade classes and achieved a Highly-Qualified Teacher status in Language Arts and Math. Afternoon Social Activities for K-4 Students

The Fort Lee Public Schools' Counseling Department has developed a virtual afternoon program for our students to have the opportunity to engage in relationship-building skills through virtual social activity. This activities program fosters social and emotional learning (SEL) and gives students the ability to interact with their peers, while trying new things and having fun. The students will participate in interactive games, activities, and discussions that will provide students the opportunity to practice effective communication, teamwork, collaborative problem-solving, and leadership skills.

The following programs are being offered:

- Grade K and 1: "Sandwiches and Show and Tell"
- Grades 2 and 3: "Munch and Mingle"
- Grade 4: "Snacks and Scattergories"

Some examples of activities for student participation include:

- "Scavenger Hunts" and "Conversation Starters" to build upon conversation skills, turn-taking, and self-awareness.
- "Mindful Breathing Practices," "I Spy," "How To," and "Show and Tell" to enhance brain power, focus and attention.
- "Charades," "Jeopardy," and "Scattergories" to give students the opportunity to practice teamwork and sportsmanship.

Additionally, students can access Mrs. Fusco's "Virtual Counselor Office" with links to various read aloud stories, skill-based practice activities, social and emotional learning (SEL) resources and follow up activities to lessons on the "Character Theme of the Month." Athletics...

Football:

Fort Lee's varsity football team finished with a record of 4-2. The team won all three away contests during the 2020 season. Highlights from the Bridgemen's home game against Bergen County Technical, a 37-34 win for Fort Lee, on October 16 were a part of News 12 New Jersey's "Friday Night Football" program for the first time in recent memory. Head Coach Charles Salame was named Coach of the Week by the New York Jets and was featured on ESPN's Monday Night Countdown before the Jets took on the New England Patriots. In their first season in the Super Football Conference Ivy Division, the team clinched a share of the Ivy Red Division.

<u>Girls Soccer:</u>

Varsity girls soccer "raised their banner" as the side clinched their first-ever title, winning the Big North Conference American Division crown in 2020. The program finished a perfect 6-0 in-division and advanced to the NJSIAA Northeast B (Group II) Regional Tournament Semi-Final at James Caldwell to end a historic season. Bridgemen Head Coach Calogero Pagano was named the Division's Coach of the Year. Five student-athletes garnered First Team All-League honors.

<u>Boys Soccer:</u>

Varsity boys soccer finished the 2020 campaign 6-4 and went 4-1 at the Sugarman Sports Complex. The team swept the season series with league foes Ridgefield Park and Dwight Morrow while also notching a win in the inaugural Suzanne Murphy Memorial Tournament. Two senior student-athletes were selected to play in the 2020 Bergen County Boys Soccer Coaches Association (BCBSCA) All-Star Game.

Girls Tennis:

Fort Lee's girls tennis team won the 2020 Big North Conference American Division title, finishing with a perfect record of 5-0 against divisional opponents. Head Coach Philip Zappel was named the Division's Coach of the Year. The entire varsity starting lineup earned First Team All-League Honors. Sophomore Stephanie Yakoff was selected to the Bergen County Women's Coaches Association (BCWCA) First Team All-County for the second consecutive season. In post season play, the Bridgemen hosted James Caldwell for the second round of the NJSIAA Northeast C Regional Tournament after receiving a bye for the opening round of play.

Cross Country:

Fort Lee's cross country team competed in a modified Big North Conference Alpha Division for the 2020 season. The girls finished in second place in both the batch meet and overall on the season with a record of 2-1 in-division. The boys program finished in fourth place but netted a bronze medalist in sophomore Ekuyami Conteh in the NJSIAA North 2, Group II State Championship Meet. Two Bridgemen, Conteh and Tiffany Park, received First Team All-League Honors in Head Coach Maria Giannattasio's inaugural campaign.

<u>Season 2 (Winter):</u>

The District's bowling and basketball (boys and girls) programs are set to compete in Season 2 (winter) of the NJSIAA's 2020-21 competition calendar with practices beginning on January 11. Indoor track and wrestling have been moved to Season 2A which will commence in mid-February. Due to NJSIAA regulations and several actions taken by the Governor, fans will not be permitted to attend indoor sporting events – including away and neutral sites – during Season 2. All varsity, and select sub-varsity, contests that take place at Fort Lee High School will be livestreamed on YouTube.
