### **CALL TO ORDER BY THE PRESIDENT**

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Board President, Ms. Colbath.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

MOTION by Mrs. Morell, seconded by Mrs. Romba, at 6:33 p.m., to move into Executive Session.

MOTION carried unanimously upon voice vote, 9-0.

The Board reconvened into the Public Meeting at 7:12 p.m.

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Mr. Kravitz shared that Priscilla Hsieh, a fourth grade student at School 3, was named winner of the national competition, <u>#ESSArtContest</u>, for the Grades 3-5 group. Mr. Kravtiz further shared that an award of \$500 will be awarded to Priscilla Hsieh and School 3.

Mr. Kravitz then shared that the Lewis F. Cole Middle School was only one of two middle schools in the entire country (817 entries) to receive a Crown Award from Columbia University's Scholastic Press Association (CSPA) at its Spring Conference. Mr. Krativtz further shared that our Intermedia 2020-21 magazine was ranked as one of the top two middle school art and literary publications in the United States.

Mr. Kravitz introduced Mr. Charles Koch and Mr. Gus Arnone of ENV, Board Architects, to discuss the 2022-2023 Capital Reserve Projects. Mr. Jack DeNichilo, Supervisor, New Construction, participated in the presentation. Mr. Koch, Mr. Arnone and Mr. DeNichilo addressed the Board's questions and concerns.
