REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Mr. Kravitz reported that he is diligently working, with the assistance of administrators, to share analyze assessment data with teachers and administrators to drive our academic success moving forward. Mr. Kravitz further shared that School #1 won an award from the Bergen County Utilities Agency with the BCUA Environmental Awareness Challenge grant of \$993.52. Mr. Kravitz introduced two high school representatives, Alexandra Conti and Kevin Rodriguez. Alexandra shared that the FLHS Model UN has an outstanding delegate. Kevin congratulated the FLHS orchestra.

Mr. Kravitz reminded everyone to give thanks for what is important with Thanksgiving coming up.

A Negotiations Committee meeting was held on Thursday, November 17, 2022 and went from 6:00 p.m. – 1:45 a.m. Paula Colbath further shared that we hope to conclude a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Fort Lee Administrators' Group (FLAG) at the next meeting.

Public commented about the lack of ethnicity and diversity of the staff and Board members over the last 20 years and how the current representation does not reflect the current population; thanked Mrs. Romba for her years of service on the Board; expressed concern about an African American Speech Therapist at School No. 1; pleasure in seeing young parents attending Board meetings and encouraging diversity; expressed displeasure that School #4 was using lunch items that were expired and that School #1's pizza is often stuck together and not served hot. Community members also expressed concerns about the lack staffing at our schools, in particular, being without a Chemistry teacher for 8 weeks and expressed concerns about the recurring challenge in fining substitute teachers.
