Ms. Colbath read Walk-in Resolutions items #3B and #4B relating to residency ineligibility.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Dr. Kravitz shared that the Lewis F. Cole Intermediate School's staff and administration are proud to be prioritizing independent reading to support student development by launching our **Reading is Out of This World** program. This is a multi-faceted initiative that begins with incorporating 20 minutes of independent reading in all ELA classrooms at least twice a week. Students will have the option of borrowing books from teacher's classroom libraries, or bringing in their own. With each book read, students will also be encouraged to complete and submit a "book cover" which will feature a design that includes; title, author, synopsis, rating, and review. Each "book cover" submitted will be displayed in our "Galaxy of Reviews" hallway on the first floor for all to see. As a further incentive, students who complete three "book covers" will receive a special Book Vending Machine Coin. This book vending machine was purchased by the district and is now thankfully filled due to the generous donation made by our current and last year's PTA. Students receiving the special coin will be able to visit the book vending machine and make a selection that offers them an opportunity to explore different genres, based on interest, outside of the curriculum. We hope that our efforts this school year will be an important step towards helping our students develop a lasting love of reading!"

Dr. Kravitz shared a big thank you to the families who came out for our first Special Education Parents Advisory Group (SEPAG) meeting of the year. It was a nice turn out and we look forward to our next meeting in December. Dr. Kravitz thanked Ms. Davis, Director of Special Services, for doing a great job organizing the meeting.

Dr. Kravitz also shared that the Fort Lee High School's Marching Band has won 2023 National Bands Group 5A champions. Congratulations to Mr. Welte and his entire staff and of course all of our musicians.

Dr. Kravitz introduced the two High School Student Representatives to share their respective updates of the activities at Fort Lee High School.

Dr. Kravitz introduced Mrs. Collazo-Baker and Ms. Drumgoole to present the Academic Assessments. This is a daunting task, and thanked the team for doing a great job preparing the Academic Assessments presentation.

Dr. Kravitz reminded everyone that November 11th is Veterans Day, and to please remember to thank all of our Veterans

Dr. Kravitz shared two logistical updates:

- 1) We are working with our architects constantly contacting the NJ State Department of Environmental Protection for final clearance to open our building at 308 Tom Hunter Road, and anticipate to receive clearance any day.
- 2) On tonight's agenda is a maternity leave replacement for our physics and chemistry class at the High School. We have a teacher who was hired two Board meetings ago and have a start date no later than December 1st. We do hope that our new hires will be released from their current district allowing them an earlier start date in our District.
